**Parenting Plan**

1. This parenting plan is a **Court Order** signed by a judge or commissioner. This is a Final order (PP).

2. **Children** - This parenting plan is for the following children:

3. **Reasons for putting limitations on a parent** (under RCW 26.09.191)

**a. Abandonment, neglect, child abuse, domestic violence, assault, or sex offense.**

Neither parent has any of these problems.

**b. Other problems** that may harm the child's best interests:

Neither parent has any of these problems.

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**4. Limitations on a parent**

Does not apply. There are no reasons for limitations checked in **3.a.** or **3.b.** above.

**5. Decision-making**

When the child is with you, you are responsible for them. You can make day-to-day decisions for the child when they are with you, including decisions about safety and emergency health care. Major decisions must be made as follows.

**a. Who can make major decisions about the children?**

**6. Dispute Resolution - If you and the other parent disagree:**

From time to time, the parents may have disagreements about shared decisions or about what parts of this parenting plan mean. To solve disagreements about this parenting plan, the parents will go to a dispute resolution provider or court. The court may only require a dispute resolution provider if there are no limitations in **3a.**

**a. The parents will go to the dispute resolution provider below:**

*If there are domestic violence issues, you may only use mediation if the victim asks for mediation, mediation is a good fit for the situation, and the victim can bring a support person to mediation.*

**b. If mediation, arbitration, or counseling is required, one parent must notify the other parent by: email our text.**

1 The parents will pay for the mediation, as follows: father will pay 50% and mother will  
2 pay 50%.

### 3 **What to expect in the dispute resolution process**

- 4 • Preference shall be given to carrying out the parenting plan.
- 5 • If you reach an agreement, it must be put into writing, signed, and both parents must  
6 get a copy.
- 7 • If the court finds that you have used or frustrated the dispute resolution process  
8 without a good reason, the court can order you to pay financial sanctions (penalties)  
9 including the other parent's legal fees.
- 10 • You may go back to court if the dispute resolution process doesn't solve the  
11 disagreement or if you disagree with the arbitrator's decision.

## 9 **7. Custodian**

10 The custodian is the father in even years, and the mother in odd years solely for the purpose  
11 of all state and federal statutes which require a designation of determination of custody.  
12 Even though one parent is called the custodian, this does not change the parenting rights  
13 and responsibilities described in this plan.

14 *(Washington law generally refers to parenting time and decision-making, rather than  
15 custody. However, some state and federal laws require that one person be named the  
16 custodian. The custodian is the person with whom the children are scheduled to reside a  
17 majority of their time.)*

## 17 **8. School Schedule**

### 18 **a. Children under School-Age**

19 Does not apply. The child is school-age.

### 20 **b. School-Age Children**

21 This schedule will apply when immediately.

22 This is a 50/50 parenting plan, with a week on/week off schedule. The child will reside with  
23 the father for the first week, and the mother for the 2nd. The transfer time will be Monday at  
24 3 PM, unless otherwise agreed.

Both parents agree to be flexible, and allowing the child to go with the other parent for the

1 evening if the other parent wants to go somewhere with the child.

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3 **9. Summer Schedule**

4 Summer begins and ends according to the school calendar.

5 The Summer Schedule is the **same** as the School Schedule **except** that each parent shall  
6 spend 2 weeks of uninterrupted vacation time with the children each summer. The parents  
7 shall confirm their vacation schedules in writing by the end of May each year. The parents  
8 agree that the father will have priority for 2 weeks in odd years, and the mother will have  
9 priority for 2 weeks in even years. If the parent with priority does not tell the other parent by  
10 the end in May, the other parent is free to make plans for the summertime, and the parent  
11 with priority will still get there 2 weeks, but will have to do it around the other parents'  
12 vacation schedule. Parties agree that "vacation schedule" is defined as one parent going  
13 somewhere with the child: trip, car trip, etc. It does not include summer camp for the child, or  
14 simply staying in the immediate area.

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17 **10. Holiday Schedule (includes school breaks)**

18 This is the Holiday Schedule for all children.

## 11. Conflicts in Scheduling

The Holiday Schedule must be observed over all other schedules. If there are conflicts within the Holiday Schedule:

Named holidays shall be followed before school breaks.

## 12. Transportation Arrangements

1 The children will be exchanged for parenting time (picked up and dropped off) at each  
2 parent's home.

3 Who is responsible for arranging transportation?

4 The **dropping off** parent - The parent whose parenting time is **ending** must arrange to  
5 have the children dropped off.

### 6 **13. Moving with the Children (Relocation)**

7 If the person with whom the children are scheduled to reside a majority of their time plans to  
8 move (relocating person), s/he **must notify** every person who has court-ordered time with  
9 the children.

#### 10 ***Move to a different school district***

11 If the move is to a different school district, the relocating person must complete the form  
12 *Notice of Intent to Move with Children* (FL Relocate 701) and deliver it at least **60 days**  
13 before the intended move.

#### 14 ***Exceptions:***

- 15 • If the relocating person could not reasonably have known enough information to  
16 complete the form in time to give 60 days' notice, s/he must give notice within **5**  
17 **days** after learning the information.
- 18 • If the relocating person is relocating to a domestic violence shelter or moving to  
19 avoid a clear, immediate and unreasonable risk to health or safety, notice may be  
20 delayed **21 days**.
- 21 • If information is protected under a court order or the address confidentiality program,  
22 it may be withheld from the notice.
- 23 • A relocating person who believes that giving notice would put her/himself or a child  
24 at unreasonable risk of harm, may ask the court for permission to leave things out of  
the notice or to be allowed to move without giving notice. Use form *Motion to Limit  
Notice of Intent to Move with Children (Ex Parte)* (FL Relocate 702).

19 The *Notice of Intent to Move with Children* can be delivered by having someone  
20 personally serve the other party or by any form of mail that requires a return receipt.

21 If the relocating person wants to change the *Parenting Plan* because of the move, s/he  
22 must deliver a proposed *Parenting Plan* together with the *Notice*.

#### 23 ***Move within the same school district***

24 If the move is within the *same* school district, the relocating person still has to let the  
other parent know. However, the notice does not have to be served personally or by  
mail with a return receipt. Notice to the other party can be made in any reasonable way.

1 No specific form is required.

2 ***Warning! If you do not notify...***

3 A relocating person who does not give the required notice may be found in contempt of  
4 court. If that happens the court can impose sanctions. Sanctions can include requiring  
5 the relocating person to bring the children back if the move has already happened, and  
6 ordering the relocating person to pay the other side's costs and lawyer's fees.

7 ***Right to object***

8 A person who has court-ordered time with the children can object to a move to a  
9 different school district and/or to the relocating person's proposed *Parenting Plan*. If the  
10 move is within the same school district, the other party doesn't have the right to object to  
11 the move but s/he may ask to change the *Parenting Plan* if there are adequate reasons  
12 under the modification law (RCW 26.09.260).

13 An objection is made by filing the *Objection about Moving with children and Petition  
14 about Changing a Parenting/Custody Order (Relocation)* (form FL Relocate 721). File  
15 your Objection with the court and serve a copy on the relocating person and anyone  
16 else who has court-ordered time with the children. Service of the *Objection* must be by  
17 personal service or by mailing a copy to each person by any form of mail that requires a  
18 return receipt. The *Objection* must be filed and served no later than **30 days** after the  
19 *Notice of intent to Move with Children* was received.

20 ***Right to move***

21 During the 30 days after the *Notice* was served, the relocating person may not move to  
22 a different school district with the children unless s/he has a court order allowing the  
23 move.

24 After the 30 days, if no *Objection* is filed, the relocating person may move with the  
children without getting a court order allowing the move.

After the 30 days, if an *Objection* has been filed, the relocating person may move with  
the children **pending** the final hearing on the *Objection* **unless**:

- The other party gets a court order saying the children cannot move, or
- The other party has scheduled a hearing to take place no more than 15 days after  
the date the *Objection* was served on the relocating person. (However, the  
relocating person may ask the court for an order allowing the move even though a  
hearing is pending if the relocating person believes that s/he or a child is at  
unreasonable risk of harm.)
- the court may make a different decision about the move at a final hearing on the  
*Objection*.

***Parenting Plan after move***

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2 If the relocating person served a proposed *Parenting Plan* with the *Notice*, **and** if no *Objection* is filed within 30 days after the *Notice* was served (or if the parties agree):

- 3
- 4 • Both parties may follow that proposed plan without being held in contempt of the *Parenting Plan* that was in place before the move. However, the proposed plan cannot be enforced by contempt unless it has been approved by a court.
  - 5 • Either party may ask the court to approve the proposed plan. Use form *Ex Parte Motion for Final Order Changing Parenting Plan – No Objection to Moving with Children* (FL Relocate 706).

## 14 **14. Other**

15 a. Either parent may vary the parenting plan by written or text agreement. Parents expect and agree that the schedule with each parent will vary depending on the children's needs and their schedule.

16 b. Both parents shall refrain from obstructing or otherwise interfering with the other's relationship with both children, including without limitation plans for vacations and holidays.

17 c. Each parent desires to remain responsible and active in the growth and development of the children consistent with the best interests of the children. The parents shall make mutual efforts to maintain open, ongoing communication concerning the development, needs and interests of the children and discuss together the major decisions which have to be made about or for the children.

18 d. Each parent shall have equal and independent authority to confer with school, day care, and other programs with regard to the children's progress, and each shall have free access to school, daycare, and other records. Each parent shall have authority to give parental consent or permission, as may be required, concerning school, daycare, or other programs for the children while the children are in his or her care.

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1 e. Each parent shall exert every reasonable effort to maintain free access and unhampered contact  
2 and communication between the children and the other parent, and promote the affections of  
3 affection, love, and respect between the children and the other parent. Neither parent shall make  
4 derogatory comments about the other parent or allow anyone else to do the same in the children's  
5 presence. Neither parent shall allow or encourage the children to make derogatory comments about  
6 the other parent.

7 f. Each parent shall be empowered to obtain emergency health care for the children without the  
8 consent of the other parent. Each parent is to notify the other parent as soon as reasonably possible of  
9 any illness requiring medical attention or of any emergency involving the children.

10 g. Each parent shall have equal and independent authority to arrange routine and emergency  
11 medical and dental services for the children while the children are in his or her care and residence.

12 h. If one parent needs child care while they have the child, they will first offer the time to the other  
13 parent.

14 i. Each child shall have reasonable telephone privileges with the parent with whom the children  
15 are not then residing without interference by the residential parent. Either parent may buy the  
16 children a cell phone for the express purpose of communicating with the children. The parent that  
17 buys the child a cell phone, will pay for the cell phone. The other parent will not unreasonably  
18 withhold the cell phone from the child, although they may withhold a cell phone for disciplinary  
19 purposes, or at bedtime. Both parents will have the children's passports to the smart phone, and have  
20 authority to look through the smart phone to make sure all apps and content are age-appropriate.

21 j. Each child shall be accompanied by the parent with whom the child is residing at the time of a  
22 given social event. The other parent shall not be limited from attendance at that event, providing such  
23 attendance by the non-residential parent is not disruptive to the other parties. Both parents will make  
24 sure the other parent is notified of children's birthday parties, and both parents have the right to attend  
the children's birthday parties, as long as they are not in the other parent's home.

k. All coordination with regard to children's schedules, visitation, extra curricular activities,  
medical or dental care, shall be done directly between the parents, and not by third parties. Parents  
shall coordinate directly with each other with regard to the children's activities and medical care.

l. Each parent shall make every effort to keep themselves apprised of school, athletic, and social  
events in which the children participate. Both parents may participate in school activities for the  
children, such as open houses, attendance at athletic events, etc.

1 m. Each parent shall provide the other parent promptly with receipt of any significant information  
2 regarding the welfare of the children, including physical and mental health, performance in school,  
3 extracurricular activities, etc.

4 n. Each parent agrees to honor the other parent's parenting style, privacy, and authority. Neither  
5 will interfere in the parenting style of the other, nor will either parent make plans and arrangements  
6 which impinge on the other parent's authority or time with the children without the express agreement  
7 of the other parent. Each parent agrees to encourage the children to discuss his or her grievance with  
8 a parent, directly with that parent. It is the intent of both parents to encourage a direct parent-child  
9 bond.

10 o. Each parent shall be encouraged to have the children participate in their religious activities.  
11 Neither parent shall disparage the other parent's religious activities or attempt to sway the children to  
12 his or her respective religious or philosophical viewpoint.

13 p. Neither parent shall advise the children of the status of child support payments or other legal  
14 matters regarding the parent's relationship. Neither parent will encourage the children to change their  
15 residence.

16 q. Neither parent shall use the children directly or indirectly to gather information about the other  
17 parent or take messages to the other parent.

18 r. The parents will notify each other at least 48 hours before any travel outside of the country. The  
19 mother will hold the passports, and will not unreasonably withhold it from the father if he needs it for  
20 travel. Either parent may take the children for vacation internationally to any country that is a  
21 signatory to the Hague convention on the civil aspects of international child abduction. Neither parent  
22 will take the children to a non-Hague convention country.

## 16. Court Order
